The recipient of the 17th annual Rend Lake College "Alumnus of the Year" award will be announced in December.


But before it ever gets to that stage, your help is needed.

ROCKFORD – When the going gets tough ... well, you know the rest.

Rend Lake College claimed another golf championship over the weekend, winning the 18-team Rock Valley Golden Eagle Classic by three strokes over runner-up John A. Logan in come-from-behind fashion.

Individual runner-up Jeremy Reidelberger led the champs with his steady, 36-hole total of 73-73–146. That was one behind the 75-70–145 by Danville Area's Casey Cartwright, who birdied five of the last six holes on the rugged Aldeen Golf Club course Friday afternoon.

Following a long, tiring trip by van earlier that morning, the RLC favorites found themselves in fourth-place, seven back to Lincoln's 294, after Thursday's opening round at Elliott Golf Course.

But Coach Dave Smith's squad regained its legs nicely

the final day to finish at 301-307-608, compared to 300-311-611 for Logan.

Lincoln, up to the test on the easier Elliott layout, faded on Friday and was third at 294-319-613, two ahead of Black Hawk at 300-315-615.

"They had to move the tournament up a day this year, and I didn't feel we needed to miss any more school, so we drove up the morning it started. Everybody else was already here," Smith said. "But we recovered and squeaked out a win."

Cartwright's finish was "incredible on that course" and snatched medalist honors from Reidelberger, who "played real steady and didn't make many mistakes," Smith added.

RLC's Zack Mayhew was next at 76-77–153, followed by Brian Kolmer at 76-78–154, Danny Johnson at 78-79–157 and Chad Penman at 76-82–158.
