


The public is invited.

The recreational and rehabilitative facility is named in honor of the founder and President of Mariah Boats, Inc., Jimmy J. Fulks, a member of the Rend Lake College Foundation Board.

When appropriated state funding was not enough to cover the actual \$2.5 million cost, the RLC Foundation and Fulks, with his total donation of \$300,000 toward the Aquatics Center, made up the difference. Local taxes were not used toward the project.

In addition to Fulks, other special donors to be recognized will include representatives of the Bank of Illinois in Mt. Vernon, Peoples National

# RLC to assist in census-taking process

The United States Census Bureau is recruiting Southern Illinoisans to work for the 2000 Census. Over 400 people will be hired during the months leading up to the census for work as enumerators, crew leaders and clerks throughout the region.

The Census Bureau is looking for individuals who want to earn money while they serve their communities. Retirees, participants in government programs and the unemployed or underemployed are urged to apply.

Census enumerators are paid \$7.25 per hour plus \$.31 per mile for the use of their automobiles. Applicants should be 18 years of age or older and U.S. citizens.

Several openings exist in Franklin County. The Census Bureau will be testing at Rend Lake College Wednesday, November 4, at both 2 p.m. and 6 p.m. in the Student Center. Those planning on taking the test will need to bring their driver's license, Social Security card and three personal and three business references.

Interested in applying but worried about the test? RLC, through the Adult Education and Job Placement programs, will offer a series of CENSUS PREP courses in Benton designed to increase a person's test scores ... The higher your score, the better chance you have of getting hired and being considered for advanced positions.

CENSUS PREP will be free. The program is specifically designed to address the topics included on the Census Field Employee Selection-Aid Test, which evaluates applicants for work as Census Enumerators, Crew Leaders and Clerks. Topics include:

- Reading Skills
- Number Skills
- Interpreting Information
- Organizational Skills
- Interpersonal Skills
- **Basic Test-Taking Strategies**
- Employability Skills

CENSUS PREP classes will be offered Mondays and Wednesdays from noon until 3 p.m. at the RLC Family Investment Education Center, 406 E. Main in Benton, beginning October 26. To register, call 435-5509.

While taking CENSUS PREP training does not guarantee employment with the Census Bureau, it can help increase test scores.

Rex Duncan, Director of Cooperative Education and Job Placement, commented, "We had great success with a similar program with the Dept. of Corrections. The Census Bureau faces many of the same recruitment challenges as DOC, and we can assist by increasing the number of local residents who pass their tests."

# **Fulks Aquatics Center dedication**

Sam McGaw, Executive Director of the Capital Development Board, will represent the State of Illinois with opening remarks. Gov. Jim Edgar is unable to attend due to a scheduling conflict. Also in attendance will be Harry Crisp, the CEO of Marion Pepsi-Cola and Chairman of the Illinois Community College Board.

Student Frank Donnelly (Mt. Vernon) and Laird Wisely, President of Physical Rehab Works and a member of the original Aquatics Center Planning Committee, will offer their perspectives during the dedication ceremony, along with Fulks, RLC President Mark S. Kern and RLC Foundation Executive Director Pat Mitchell.

The National Anthem will be presented by Instructor Julie Wilkerson and the Rend Lake College Choir.

Tours of the facility and refreshments will conclude the program. The facility features a six-lane, 75-foot pool with a ramp for the physically challenged. A 10-by-20-foot therapy pool and 10-foot diameter whirlpool serve many rehabilitative needs of citizens within the community.

Also included are modern locker room facilities for both men and women, as well as a family changing room for those who may need special assistance from a spouse/parent of the opposite sex. An outdoor patio for relaxing and entertaining purposes is under construction.

The lobby of the Aquatics Center adjoins James (Hummer) Waugh Gymnasium and now serves as the main entrance for both facilities.

"The Aquatics Center is beautiful," President Kern said at the time of the opening on February 9, in time for Spring Semester '98 classes. "Without a doubt, it has the best handicap-accessibility of any such recreational/rehabilitation facility in Southern Illinois. We are fortunate to have such an addition to our campus."

Added Kern, "State officials were willing to approve this project based upon Rend Lake College's commitment to use the facility as a community and therapeutic pool, our willingness to promote tourism in conjunction with Wayne Fitzgerrell State Park and the fact there are no public indoor pools located in the eight-county district."

The Mt. Vernon-based firm of Wilson, Hodge and Groh Architectural Corp., designed the facility, with Richard Brieseacher Construction as the general contractor.

In addition to recreational swimming hours open to the general public, the Aquatics Center schedule includes beginning and intermediate swimming classes; arthritis aquatics classes, designed primarily with senior citizens in mind; prenatal aquatics classes for expectant mothers; water aerobics exercise classes; lifeguarding; aquatic recreational games, and "Aquatic Aerobics Fitness," offered on an individualized basis both for college credit and pass-fail.

Single and family memberships may be purchased. Guests at the nearby Rend Lake Resort and Visitors Center, located in Wayne Fitzgerrell State Park, have access to the college facilities. It also is available on a retainer basis for area therapists and patients. Private and group rental of the complex is a possibility on select days.

Recreational swimming hours are scheduled around class periods. It is open to members and the general public from 6-9 a.m., 2-4 p.m. and 6-9 p.m. throughout the week, noon-5 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays.
